## Here's How YOU Can Get Involved

### Scouting Is.... Poster Contest

February 2009-February 2010

Scouts are encouraged to submit posters explaining what Scouting means to them. The posters can be drawn, painted, etc but must be submitted on 11x17 paper.

Submissions will be accepted on an on-going basis and each month a poster will be chosen and displayed at libraries throughout our Council territory. One Cub Scout, Boy Scout and Venturing/Explorer poster will be chosen and showcased in The Scouter and on the Council website.

### 100 Year Flag Streamers

February 2009– June 2010

Units will have the opportunity to earn a special 100 year celebration streamer for their flag. Units can qualify for the streamer by participating in at least one 100 year celebration activity. Streamers will be presented on an on-going basis at District Roundtables. Qualification is determined by the District's 100 year celebration representative.

### Parade Float Contest

April 2009-October 2009

Units are encouraged to participate in local parades. We ask that their floats have a theme based around the 100 year celebration. Before, during, or after the parade the unit should take a picture of their float and submit it to their Council Service Center where they will be judged at the end of the year. The photo must be printed as a 5x7 or emailed. Floats may participate in any parades within the time-frame specified. A winner will be announced in December 2009.

### Parade Banners

January 2009– December 2010

Banners will be created to be featured in the parades that units participate in. The banner will feature Simon Kenton Council's 100 year logo and will lead the many unit floats in the parades. Banners will be distributed by District 100 year celebration representatives and will be featured in the larger parades within our Council territory.

### Tree Planting Ceremonies

Arbor Day 2009 & 2010

A tree planting ceremony will be held on Arbor Day in each major community throughout Simon Kenton Council territory. Trees and a plaque will be provided for each ceremony and locations will be determined by the 100 year committee. Trees will be planted in visible locations near City Halls, Downtown, Major Landmarks, etc. Scouters, community leaders and the Mayor should be included in these ceremonies. Additional trees may be purchased for ceremonies in areas not chosen.

### Alumni Pin Presentations

February 2009– February 2010

A special lapel pin will be distributed to those Alumni who are found during the 100 year celebration. Special presentations will be scheduled to present alumni lapel pins at City Council meetings, School Administration Offices, major businesses/organizations, to media personalities, etc. Each lapel pin will be attached to a card that will tell the alumni how to reconnect with Scouting. To schedule a special presentation in your area, contact your District 100 year representative.

### Alumni Finder Patch

Feb. 2009-Dec. 2010

A round recruiter patch will be developed for adults who find Scouting Alumni and get them back involved or re-registered. Patches will be distributed by your District 100 year representative at District Roundtables.

### Celebration Kick-Off

February 2009

Join us for a special celebration to kick-off the 100 year anniversary of Scouting. A reception will be held to jump start the festivities surrounding the celebration. This special event will be open to current Scouters and the general public. An invitation will go out closer to the event with details.

### Statehouse Celebration

February 2010

A special event will be held at the Statehouse during the month of the 100 year Anniversary. It will conclude our Council's celebration plan. The event will include Scouters, community leaders, state leaders and the public. It's an event you won't want to miss.
